Annual Campout

We have a group camp reserved for up to 40 people at Williams Grove on the Ave of the Giants, off Hwy 101, Humboldt Redwoods State Park.

We will arrive Fri Jul 17, and leave Mon Jul 20. Cost will be prorated, about \$16/camping unit total. You can stay shorter periods if you let us know, but no discount. We expect to have room for lots of guests, but to make this possible, you MUST RSVP member and guest count and arrival to Les, W6TEE or Marc, W6MAR, no later than the July 12 meeting.

Besides sight-seeing in the redwoods, there will be a day trip to the lost coast, the undeveloped area on the ocean, west of camp. We can double up on trips away from camp for those unable to move their vehicle. The camp itself is in heavy forest and is next to a fork of the Eel River. Tables and barbeques are clustered at one point in camp. A set of rest rooms is shared with the other group site.

To get to Williams Grove, take Hwy 101 north, either via Santa Rosa, or by way of Clear Lake, to the Meyers Flat exit, north of Garberville. Continue north through Meyers Flat 1 mile to Williams Grove on the left. Note that Williams Grove is signed as a day use area, and after entering, you pass several group day use sites. The two group camp sites are on a loop at the very end of the road. We have site B reserved. Allow at least five hours travel time from Sacramento. PLEASE take these directions along. See Marc's article on campout repeaters.

CAMPOUT REPEATERS

For those who will arrive at the July campout late on Friday or on Saturday, the repeaters in the area are 146.610 in Garberville and 146.760 on Mt. Pierce outside of Scotia. The two are linked full time and the PL is 103.5 Hz. Start monitoring 146.610 first around the Laytonville area and then use 146.760 somewhere north of Redway. Keep in mind that this is rugged, mountainous country and repeater coverage will be spotty to non-existent in many areas.

We should have HT coverage for 146.760 in the campground, however. There is a repeater on Grasshopper Peak, which is in the state park which should work well, also. One of us will monitor that, too. It is a solar-powered station running 20 or 30 watts or so. The frequency is 147.330 with a PL of 103.5. There is a map of Humboldt County repeaters located at http://www.sharkk.com/pages/fwra.htm. It is quite handy.


