Answer to July's newsletter puzzle: Two Way Radio

REPEATER LORE

Why we simplex when caravanning and not use the repeater. When transmitting on a repeater, we produce a strong signal to nearby receivers on a frequency different than the one they hear you on (the repeater). This blocks (silences) the close receivers. For the same reason, do not talk on another repeater when caravanning. Also, simplex is a more efficient use of frequencies when possible. - W6TEE
